WORK SESSION MINUTES

Attendees: Gary Wall, Tony Bartolotta, Steve Thomas, Karen Joliat, Margaret Birch arrived at 4:35

1. Frembes Parking Lot discussion of sale
 - a. all trustees agree to sell and to offer to the owners of the storefronts only the price the Township paid for the lots which is \$3.00
 - b. The Supervisor will initiate lot combination so all the parcels that comprise the parking lot are combined into one parcel
 - c. The taxes will be assessed to the owners in the same percentage as they share ownership of the lot
2. Railroad Crossing Quiet Zone discussed
 - a. Supervisor got a call from a resident wanting the Township to establish a Quiet Zone on the railroad crossing near him. After investigating the Supervisor found that any improvements made to a Quiet Zone to make it "quiet" must be paid for by the Township. All trustees agreed this was not practical or possible with our budget
3. Single Trash Hauler
 - a. Tony will find out which companies have contracts with their customers and whether or not they can be cancelled once the Township implements a Single Trash Hauler Ordinance
 - b. Timeline has yet to be established
 - c. All trustees to mark up the W Bloomfield ordinance for review
 - d. Sue will compile all survey results
4. Woodbine traffic cut through
 - a. Police Dept had officers on site for 5 days and issued only 5 speeding tickets
 - b. Various signage possibilities were discussed
5. Medical Marijuana
 - a. Recreational Marijuana may change all the rules
 - b. Bartolotta said we should prepare a Marijuana Ordinance and be ready in case not having one leaves us with the inability to control what marijuana facilities move into the township
 - c. There is not enough revenue to make this a go with the Township. The state is considering reallocating the portion that goes to the County Police if you don't use their services for patrol, according to Lynn Goetz
 - d. Car insurance will increase substantially if Recreation Marijuana is approved
 - e. Sue will send sample ordinance to all trustees
6. Community Center

- a. Sue will send latest draft of plan from Koseck to all trustees
- 7. Absentee Ballot applications coming back at this time
 - a. Ballots scheduled for mailing June 29
- 8. Lisa Plunkett calling around to Trustees, radio station, etc. concerned about the timing of the Police and Fire SAD
- 9. Oakwood subdivision road repair was denied by RCOC because the people who travel on it but don't own property abutting it wanted to pay for the repair
 - a. Steve will confirm this before bringing it to a Board Meeting
- 10. Mike Healy sent an email while we were in this meeting indicating he will be stepping down since he just moved out of Waterford
