6. New Business

6.1 SCADA Upgrade for Water Treatment Facility 31-1

The following memo was received from Justin Westlake, Human Resources Director.

Perceptive Controls has been working with the Waterford DPW over the past few years to update the SCADA hardware and programming associated with all our water treatment plants and sewer pumping stations. The SCADA system is critical for our operations. The system sends out automatic alerts when we have pump faults, high water alarms, chlorine leaks, and many other problematic scenarios. Using this system, we can monitor what our various water and sewer sites are doing from a remote location and send out a technician if an issue arises.

Perceptive Controls is a single source vendor for Waterford Township and has written the programming for all our sites, working closely with our staff to fix any issues our technicians have with the system as they arise. They are currently working on water treatment facility 16-1 & 2 with our electricians to get that all updated. We will do our best to finish up the water treatment facilities portion of the SCADA updates in 2022.

This project was a Board approved budget expense for 2022 and will be coded to account number: 59041-92180.

6.2 DPW Vehicle/Equipment Purchase Request

The following memo was received from.

Please see the attached quotes for the purchase of a new Caterpillar 306 excavator and two 4x4 pick-up trucks. There are two copies of the truck-pricing sheet because we will be purchasing two of the exact same truck.

The excavator will be used every day for watermain taps, service line leaks, watermain breaks, and sewer repairs. With the purchase of this machine, it will help the Distribution crew make repairs safer and with less property damage. This machine has longer reach capabilities, more horsepower, and is equipped with the latest safety features and accessories.

The DPW tries to buy a few vehicles every year and keep our fleet relatively updated so we do not get in a situation where we need to replace a large portion of our fleet in one year and put unnecessary strain on the budget. These two trucks are already made and waiting for Board approval to go pick up. We are struggling through the supply chain problems like everyone else, so we felt this was fortunate.

Michigan CAT has been in business for many years and offers Government pricing to us. We have demoed this machine from Michigan CAT. They provide excellent service and warranties on their equipment. Waterford Township has purchased our vehicles through Wenzel Buick GMC for many years and they have extended their Oakland County government pricing to us. (See attached e-mail)

These purchases were Board approved budget items for 2022. The price did increase by \$2,271.00 over the quote from 2021 for the mini excavator. We believe we can absorb the increased cost with our budget as it is currently, so we are not requesting a budget amendment at this time. The purchase of the mini excavator will be coded to account# 59045-97136. One Pickup truck will be for the Sewer Branch and coded to 59055-97136, and the other is for the Distribution Branch and will be coded to 59045-97136.

6.3 Peerless Midwest Well Maintenance / Budget Amendment Request

Please see the attached proposal from Peerless Midwest to perform maintenance and rehabilitative services on Waterford's production wells and pumps. A brief description of each task and the associated cost is given in the table below:

Peerless Midwest is Waterford's single source provider of well consulting/contracting services since 2009. They have completed countless inspections, reports, and services for Waterford's wells. The work they perform keeps the pumps and motors that provide Waterford's water supply in good working order.

The work we are looking to accomplish this year has increased above the allotted \$200,000 since the budget hearings. The pump motor for the 28-1 well is currently offline due to a short in the motor. We will not know the extent of the damage until this 250 HP motor gets pulled and evaluated. For this reason, we are asking the Board to authorize a budget increase in the amount of \$87,551 from the Water & Sewer Enterprise fund to account number 59041-92230 to allow us to move forward with the recommended projects for 2022 and get 28-1 well back online.

6.4 District Court Exterior Renovation / Budget Amendment Request

The following memo was received from Mr. Justin Westlake.

Please see the attached quote from National Restoration for exterior restoration activities at Waterford's District Court.

This building has never undergone any major exterior restoration efforts. As with any structure, exposure to elements has caused some break down and discoloration of some of the bricks and mortar joints on the building. The attached bid proposes work tuck pointing of deteriorated mortar joints, reapplication of deteriorated sealants, cleaning and painting exposed steel, replacement of approximately 100 cracked and broken bricks, and cleaning and inspection of the steel I-beams and welds.

National Restoration Inc. has completed an evaluation of the entire District Court exterior and submitted the attached proposal. Mr. Fletcher of National Restoration Inc. has directed similar work for Waterford Township in 2020 on the Town Hall building exterior. They were always quick to accommodate our needs, providing minimal disruption to Waterford Township staff and citizens utilizing the facility. We look forward to working with this organization again, and to having the District Court exterior restored properly.

National Restoration is completing this work on a time and material basis using the rates under their publicly bid contract with Oakland County MI. Mr. Fletcher estimates this project to cost \$60,000 based on his evaluation.

This project was NOT a Board approved budget expense for 2022 and will require a budget amendment of \$66,000 from the general fund into account number 11360-97106 if the Board chooses to move forward with this project. I do recommend this project get done soon if the Board decides against this proposal, and it is a strong possibility it costs more to do this work in 2023 due to unfavorable inflationary conditions.

6.5 **Resolution to Adopt Poverty Exemption**

The following memo was received from Chief Assessor, Paula Moore.

**RESOLUTION TO ADOPT POVERTY EXEMPTION
POLICY AND GUIDELINES FOR 2022**

WHEREAS, the adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is required of the Township Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the principal residence of persons, who the Assessor and Board of Review determines by reason of poverty to be unable to contribute to the public charge, is eligible for exemption in whole or in part from taxation under Public Act 253 of 2020 (MCL 211.7u); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 253 of 2020, the Township of Waterford, Oakland County, adopts the following guidelines and those on the attached Policy and Guidelines for Poverty Exemptions for the Board of Review to implement. The guidelines shall include, but not be limited to, the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household, including any property tax credit returns, filed in the current or immediately preceding year; and

WHEREAS, in order to qualify for a poverty exemption, property owners must submit an application using the form attached to this Resolution. The Board of Review shall consider the income and asset guidelines listed below along with the attached Policy and Guidelines for Poverty Exemptions for Waterford Township.

Income: The income guidelines shall be no more than 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines as follows:

Asset Test: To be eligible for a poverty exemption for 2022, assets (excluding the principal residence and one vehicle) shall not exceed \$25,000 for one person and \$35,000 for two or more people living in the household.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Assessor and Board of Review shall follow the above-stated policies and federal guidelines (and the Policy and Guidelines attached hereto) in granting or denying an exemption, unless the Assessor and Board of Review determines there are substantial and compelling reasons why there should be a deviation from the policies and federal guidelines and these reasons are communicated in writing.

Resolution to Adopt Poverty Exemption Continued.

In accordance with Public Act (P.A.) 253 of 2020, guidelines for a Poverty Exemption must be set by the local governing body. Guidelines for the Charter Township of Waterford are as follows:

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. All applicants must obtain the Poverty Exemption Application from the Township Assessor's Office or obtain it online at www.waterfordmi.gov. Please call (248) 674-6270 for assistance.
2. Applicants will not be eligible for consideration if their income is greater than 200% of the income levels listed below:

**All guidelines are based on the Federal poverty level established by P.A. 390 of 1994 and further amended by P.A. 253 of 2020.

3. All applicants must own and occupy the property being appealed as their principal residence. If requested, a valid driver's license, deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership or identification and verification of information must be produced.
4. All applicants must fill out the State of Michigan application form in its entirety and return it to this office.
5. All members of the household must submit, if applicable, the immediately preceding year or current year copies of:
 - A. Federal Income Tax Return – 1040 or 1040A
 - B. State of Michigan General Homestead Property Tax Claim MI-1040CR
 - C. Statement from Social Security Administration and/or Michigan Social Services as to monies received during the previous year.
 - D. Alimony, child support and military family allotments or other regular support from an absent family member or someone not living in the household.
6. FAILURE TO SUPPLY THE REQUESTED INFORMATION WILL NEGATE THE APPLICATION BEING PROCESSED.

Resolution to Adopt Poverty Exemption Continued.**EVALUATION PROCEDURE**

1. Applications may be reviewed by the Board of Review without the applicant being present. However, the Board may request that any and all applicants be physically present to respond to any questions the Board may have. This means that an applicant could be called to appear on short notice.
2. At this meeting, an applicant should be prepared to answer questions regarding their financial affairs, health, the status of people living in their home, etc.
3. The Board of Review will apply a two-part test to determine the eligibility and the amount of the exemption.
 - A. **THE INCOME TEST:** The Federal Income Guidelines will be used as part of the Income Test for 100% Poverty Exemption. 150% of the Federal Income Guidelines will be used for a 50% Poverty Exemption. 200% of the Federal Income Guidelines will be used for a 25% Poverty Exemption.
 - B. **THE ASSET TEST:**
 - i. The residence where the applicant claims the Principal Residence Exemption and one vehicle are not considered in the Asset Test.
 - ii. The asset threshold for Waterford Township is \$25,000 for one person living in the household and \$35,000 for two or more people living in the household.
 - iii. Assets include, but are not limited to: real estate other than principal residence, personal property, additional motor vehicles, recreational vehicles and equipment, certificates of deposit, savings accounts, checking accounts, stocks, bonds, life insurance, retirement funds, etc.
 - iv. If the values of the applicant's assets are of an amount which would indicate that a condition of poverty is not indicated, then a poverty exemption may be denied.
 - C. **THE INCOME FROM OTHER SOURCES TEST:** If the Board of Review determines that the applicant has or should have income from other sources, such as relatives, dependents or friends, they may add this income to the applicant's reported income and if the resulting sum of these incomes is greater than the stated household income guidelines, then a poverty exemption may be denied. If the amount of this income is added to the applicant's reported income and the resulting sum is less than the stated household income guidelines, then a poverty exemption will be granted. The homeowner cannot use expenses and deduction to lower their income. These areas of expenses and deductions are for Federal taxes.
4. The Board of Review must agree as to the disposition of the poverty claim for the exemption to be granted.
5. Any successful applicant may be subject to personal investigation by the Township. This would be done to verify information submitted or statements made to the Board of Review in regard to their property tax abatement claim.
6. The Assessor will keep minutes of all proceedings before the Board of Review and all meetings must be held in a municipal building.

7. A person filing a poverty exemption claim is not prohibited from also appealing the Assessed Value on the property for which that claim is made before the March Board of Review in the same year.
8. The Board of Review shall follow the policy and guidelines of the Township of Waterford in granting or denying an exemption under this section.
9. All applicants, claiming the poverty exemption, who meet eligibility requirements, shall receive from the Board of Review a 25%, 50% or 100% reduction in Taxable Value for the year in which the exemption is granted.

We have reviewed these schedules and determined they are both outdated and obsolete. One was approved by the State on August 7, 1979 and the other on August 7, 2001.

We currently follow the State of Michigan, General Schedule #11, for Local Law Enforcement Agencies, which meets the administrative, legal, fiscal and archival requirements of the State of Michigan.

We are requesting this honorable body adopt a resolution declaring these schedules obsolete and confirming the Waterford Police Department follows General Schedule #11 as adopted by the State of Michigan.

Once completed, we will submit your resolution to the State so the outdated schedules can be rescinded.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on August 7, 1979, and August 7, 2001, the State Archives of Michigan approved two separate Retention and Disposal Schedules submitted by the Waterford Police Department; and,

WHEREAS, the previously approved Retention and Disposal Schedules are still on file with the State of Michigan; and,

WHEREAS, the Retention and Disposal Schedules approved in 1979, and 2001, respectively, are both outdated and obsolete; and,

WHEREAS, the Waterford Police Department currently follows the State of Michigan, General Schedule #11, for Local Law Enforcement Agencies, which meets the administrative, legal, fiscal, and archival requirements for the State of Michigan.
