The "Notify Me" feature on the Township website allows those who opt-in to receive an email anytime that an alert is published; signing up for notifications is easy and can be done by clicking the "Notify Me" button on the home page of our Township website. Community members can also sign up for the CivicReady system that is used to send important messages involving the safety or welfare of Waterford Township. Township officials can send out emergency notifications by phone, email, and text through this system to the specific geographic area being affected. 
