On November 13, 2025, Parks and Recreation held the annual Veterans luncheon. **9. New Business****9.1 Purchase of FARO-Focus 3D Scanner with Accessories, Training, 2 User Licenses, and 5-year Complete Care**

The following memo was received by Police Chief Underwood.

The Waterford Police Department often needs to document both crime and crash scenes in order to reconstruct those events for criminal prosecutions as well as civil and/or administrative proceedings. In many of these cases we photograph the scene, take measurements, and digitally scan the area. This enables evidence technicians and crash re-constructionists to not only re-exam the scene after the fact, but also to create scale diagrams for presentation during court and/or administrative hearings.

For digital scanning, we currently use a Nikon-NPR-352 Total Station, which is approximately 20 years-old. That instrument has served the department well, but reached the end of its life-cycle years ago. The Nikon is no longer supported by the manufacturer, which forced us to a third-party vendor to provide software that would allow us to extract data from the device. Once the data is extracted, another software package is used to analyze the data and produce a diagram of the scene(s).

Our current process is inefficient and extremely time consuming. Not to mention, with the age of our Nikon instrument, the potential for failure is always present.

FARO Technologies is the company that has provided us with the third-party software described above. We have done further research into their products and found them to be an industry leader. In addition, our current software will work with their Focus Core 100m 3D Scanner, which is the instrument that fits our needs.

Purchase of FARO-Focus 3D Scanner with Accessories, Training, 2 User Licenses, and 5-year Complete Care Continued.

FARO Technologies has provided hardware, accessories, and services to both municipal and federal agencies, including, but not limited to; FBI, U.S. Coast Guard, U.S. Navy, USDA, and Altamonte Springs FL. These agencies have considered FARO Technologies as the sole developer/manufacture of the hardware as well as their proprietary FARO Zone Software which incorporates direct integration of FARO Focus point data, for full scene documentation, 2D and 3D diagrams, animations, crash scene reconstruction, bullet trajectory, and blood stain pattern analysis.

Total cost as quoted by FARO Technologies, including FARO Focus Core 100m 3D Scanner, battery pack, tripod, flash, on-site training, 2 user licenses, and 5-year complete care, is \$64,795.65. This price includes a negotiated discount of \$14,301.00.

Based on the information set forth above, we respectfully request this honorable body approve this expenditure from FARO Technologies, Inc, in the amount of \$64,795.65. Funds are available in the Police Department's restricted-use federal drug forfeiture fund.

## **9.2 Hydrant Truck Purchase / Budget Adjustment – DPW**

The following memo was received by Mr. Justin Westlake, DPW Director.

Please see the attached quote for the purchase of a new Fire Hydrant Service Truck for the Water Department from Fox Ford Mazda out of Grand Rapids, MI.

The new truck will be used daily to repair Waterford's fire hydrants that need service. The truck will be equipped with a crane large enough to lift and set hydrants that need to have parts replaced, or ones that get hit by cars. This vehicle is large enough to store parts for the different types of hydrants we have in our distribution system. It also has a large bed to transport hydrants to our shop that cannot be worked on out in the field.

This truck will be replacing a hydrant repair truck that was severely damaged in a car accident a couple of months ago. It is anticipated the current truck will be totaled and any money we receive from the insurance company will be placed back into the 590 fund to offset the cost of this replacement vehicle.

Hydrant Truck Purchase / Budget Adjustment – DPW Continued.

Fox Ford Mazda is offering a Municipal discount to us in the amount of \$6,500. Typically, a vehicle like this has to be built; however, DPW staff was able to locate this vehicle that will suit our needs already built and available for purchase.

The purchase of this truck will require a budget amendment of \$161,195 to account number 59045-97136

**CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF WATERFORD**  
**INVESTMENT POLICY AMENDMENT RESOLUTION**

**RECITALS:**

A. The Investment Policy for the Charter Township of Waterford ("Township"), as recommended and administered by the Township Treasurer, was adopted on April 28, 2008, and amended on June 13, 2011, and February 10, 2014, by the Township Board of Trustees.

B. To provide flexibility in the portfolio diversification, the Townships Investment Policy Consultant, Robinson Captial, and the Township Treasurer has recommended, and the Township Board has determined, that the former Section 12.1 of the Investment Policy be removed and Appendix A, Portfolios Diversification Guidelines be added, as well as a few minor wording changes as provided in the revised Policy and this Resolution.

**IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED:** That Section 12.1 0 of the Township's Investment Policy titled Diversification by Instrument is deleted and Appendix A is added to read as follows:

1. Section 11.0 Safekeeping and Custody, add "All security transactions, including collateral for repurchase agreement, shall be conducted on a deliver-versus-payment (DVP) basis.
2. Section 12 Diversification, add "Federal Agency securities" as an exception to the types of investments that may comprise more than fifty percent of the investment portfolio. Also add a reference to "see Appendix A".

**9.4 Resolution Supporting Township Submission of the Oakland County 2026 Access to Transit Program for the M-59 Corridor Walkability, Transit Access, and Gap Elimination Initiative**

The following memo was received by Mr. Jeffrey Polkowski, Development Services Director.

At the Board of Budget Hearing on October 30, 2025, the Board reviewed the 2017 Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating (PASER) Study and determined that a portion of the remaining American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds should be directed toward improving high-priority sidewalk infrastructure. As part of that discussion, the Board proposed allocating \$625,000 to continue rehabilitation efforts for prominent sidewalk corridors throughout the Township.

The PASER study identifies the stretch of Highland Road between Cass Lake Road and Williams Lake Road as one of the Township's most heavily used pedestrian routes, yet it remains among the lowest-rated in terms of surface condition not yet addressed from the PASER. This area also serves as a primary transit corridor for SMART, making it eligible for funding under the Oakland County Access to Transit Program. For the 2026 cycle, Oakland County has dedicated \$2 million to this Program to support municipal projects that enhance safety, connectivity, and overall access to public transit.

The Township's proposed project aims to remedy deficiencies along this corridor by reconstructing deteriorated sidewalk segments and installing short extensions of new pathway to eliminate existing gaps. These improvements will establish a continuous, ADA-compliant pedestrian network linking major transit stops, commercial destinations, and activity centers along M-59. The project directly supports the goals of the Township's adopted Master Plan and advances long-term mobility and accessibility priorities.

Resolution Supporting Township Submission of the Oakland County 2026 Access to Transit Program for the M-59 Corridor Walkability, Transit Access, and Gap Elimination Initiative Continued.

The total estimated project cost is \$642,609.00. Waterford Township is seeking \$321,305.00 in Program funds, with the Township providing a local match through a portion of these ARPA funds and remaining project costs through fiscal allocations spanning 2026–2028. If awarded, the Township will enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Oakland County.

A Board resolution is necessary for grant submission. Staff recommends approval of the attached resolution authorizing a 2026 Access to Transit Program application in the amount of \$321,305.00 and delegating authority to the Director of Development Services to execute all associated documents and oversee project administration.

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING TOWNSHIP SUBMISSION OF THE OAKLAND COUNTY 2026 ACCESS TO TRANSIT PROGRAM FOR THE M-59 CORRIDOR WALKABILITY, TRANSIT ACCESS, AND GAP ELIMINATION INITIATIVE**

WHEREAS voters passed the Oakland County Public Transportation Millage in November 2022; and

WHEREAS the Oakland County Board of Commissioners appropriated \$2 million of Oakland County Public Transportation Millage to create the Oakland County 2026 Access to Transit Program (the “Program”); and

WHEREAS the Program seeks to assist cities, villages, and townships in Oakland County to further the enhancement and expansion of public transit services by providing limited matching funds to support their efforts in making transit stops easier and safer to get to and more comfortable to wait at; and

WHEREAS the Charter Township of Waterford (the “Community”) seeks to submit a Program application for the M-59 Corridor Walkability, Transit Access, and Gap Elimination Initiative, a project that will repair and complete missing segments of pedestrian pathway along the western side of Highland Road (M-59), one of the Community’s most heavily traveled state trunklines and a primary route for regional public transit; and

WHEREAS existing discontinuous sidewalk segments along this corridor currently limit safe pedestrian movement, restrict ADA accessibility, and impede reliable access to bus stops and other essential community destinations; and

WHEREAS the proposed project will eliminate these gaps by reconstructing deteriorated sections, installing new sidewalks where none presently exists, and bringing the pathway into compliance with modern safety and accessibility standards, thereby establishing a continuous and walkable connection between key transit stops, commercial areas, residential neighborhoods, and civic amenities along the M-59 corridor; and

WHEREAS by enhancing multimodal mobility and improving safe, equitable access to transit services, the initiative directly supports Township priorities related to economic development, public safety, transportation equity, and long-term corridor revitalization; and

WHEREAS the proposed application is supported by the adopted Waterford Township Master Plan; and

Resolution Supporting Township Submission of the Oakland County 2026 Access to Transit Program for the M-59 Corridor Walkability, Transit Access, and Gap Elimination Initiative Continued.

WHEREAS the Charter Township of Waterford has prepared a Program application in the amount of \$321,305.00, based on a total project cost of \$642,609.00, to fund Preliminary Engineering, Construction, and Construction Engineering for the desired and proposed improvements; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Waterford Board of Trustees hereby approves the submission of an application to 2026 Access to Transit Program in the amount of \$321,305.00 based on a total project cost of \$642,609.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the project is approved, the Charter Township of Waterford will enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Oakland County, which will require the Charter Township of Waterford to make available a local match and other grant funding through financial commitment of \$642,609.00 during the 2026-2028 fiscal years.
