

From the Director

This year our library participated in the Geek the Library campaign. This program, funded by the Gates Foundation, is a national program to promote library support in their local communities. Our program featured “I geek...” posters of over 250 Waterford residents sharing what they are passionate about ranging from books to sports to superheroes to their children. The “I geek...” posters decorated all areas of the interior of the Library and were also displayed on one of the exterior walls at the entrance.
