Good afternoon.

When we went through the medical marihuana selection process, certain applicants were disqualified because of outstanding obligations owed to the Township.

Naturally, my client does not want to make a fatal mistake when their adult-use application is reviewed (assuming the Board approves the ordinance).

We received the 2023 Summer Tax statement that shows it is payable between July 1, 2023 - September 14, 2023.

If this tax bill is not paid when the adult-use application is reviewed (assuming it is reviewed before September 14th), would we be disqualified because of an "outstanding" obligation?

Or does "outstanding" mean past-due?
